ATLANTIC CENTER FOR THE ARTS 2023 MENTORING ARTISTS-IN-RESIDENCE PROGRAM

Since 1977, Atlantic Center for the Arts (ACA) has fostered a spirit of innovation and collaboration among the world's greatest writers, painters, sculptors, choreographers, and composers through Mentoring Artist led residencies held on its 68-acre campus. ACA provides workspace and technical support to artists from all over the world to create without interruption, within an atmosphere conducive to intellectual exchange and artistic development. Emerging and mid-career artists are invited to apply to work with renowned Mentoring Artists for a three-week residency. The ACA residency program is free for accepted artists, and includes private living quarters, daily prepared meals, and 24-hour access to studio space. Residency #188 / February 12 to March 4: Composer Judd Greenstein, co-director of New Amsterdam Records and curator of New York's Ecstatic Music Series; Emmy Award-winning cartoonist Dean Haspiel; and writer Susanna Sonnenberg, the author of two memoirs, *Her Last Death and She Matters: A Life in Friendships, a New York Times Editors' Choice*, both published by Scribner.

Residency #189 / May 14 to June 3: MacArthur winning visual artist and filmmaker Sky Hopinka; Rone Shavers, a finalist for the Council of Literary Magazines and Presses' 2021 Firecracker Award in Fiction; and Nina C. Young, a composer whose works have been presented by Carnegie Hall, the National Gallery and the Whitney Museum.

Residency #190 / June 25 to July 15: The themed residency, *Forums for Storytelling*, is an experience designed to unfurl the power of overlapping ideas, abstraction, the body, and materiality as forums for contemporary storytelling. Visual Artist Alteronce Gumby's artistic practice includes painting, ceramics, installation, and performance. Gumby's work has been exhibited at galleries such as Hauser & Wirth, Gladstone Gallery, and Camden Arts Centre. Ghanaian-American curator and cultural critic Larry Ossei-Mensa co-founded ARTNOIR, which celebrates the artistry and creativity of Black and Brown artists around the world.

Residency #191 / October 8 to 28: Missy Mazzoli, a Grammy-nominee and Mead Composer-in-residence at the Chicago Symphony Orchestra; multimedia visual artist, composer, and musician Paul Rucker, who received the Smithsonian Artist Research Fellowship—the first artist in residence at the new National Museum of African American Culture; and Addae Moon, playwright / dramaturg / director / cultural worker.

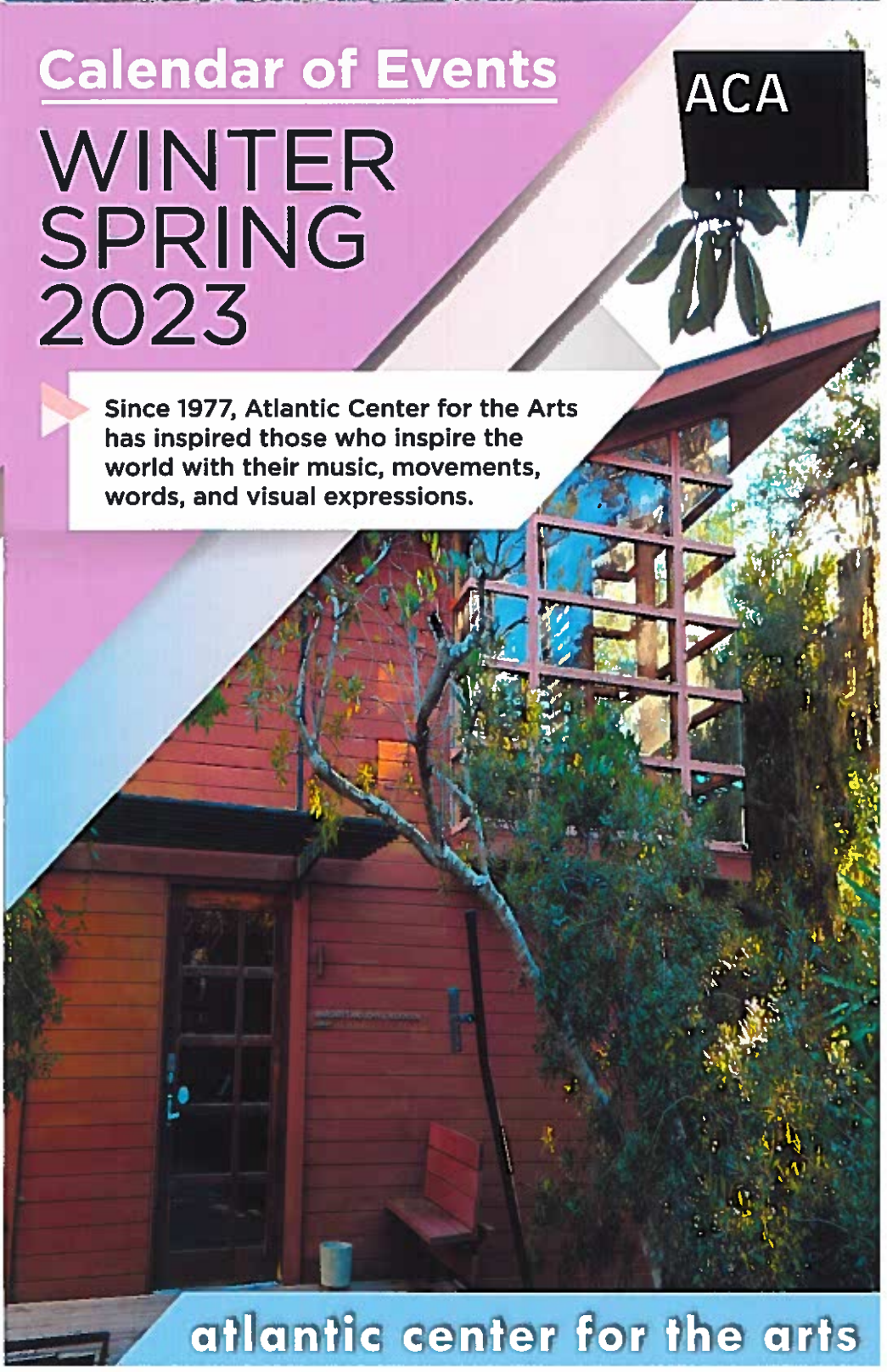

Acoustic ecology, also called soundscape studies, is a discipline that studies the relationship, mediated through sound, between human beings and their environment.

This partnership supports the work of ACA in sound art, bringing global attention to its current programs, including the 5th Soundscape Field Station artist residency at Canaveral National Seashore in February, the Young Sound Seekers program that is supported by the National Park Service in partnership with Stetson University and teens from the Conklin Davis Center for the Visually Impaired, and the long-standing Soundwalk series.

Listening Past - **Listening Futures** features keynote presentations by author David George Haskell (*Sounds Wild and Broken*), radio host and former advisor to the Canada Council for the Arts, Claude Schryer, and sound artist/professor Amanda Gutierrez of Concordia University. The conference convenes March 23 - 26 at ACA, with interactive public workshops beginning March 19 in New Smyrna Beach. The conference and events are open to everyone. To register, visit wfae.net.
